What is the Indigenous Bursary

For office use only.

\$2000 bursaries are available for Indigenous students in part-time degree, diploma, certificate, or technical/trades programs connecting to BC Hydro careers. Visit bchydro.com/community/indigenous-relations/opportunities/individuals/donations_sponsorships.html for eligible programs.

The \$8,000 Randy Brant Memorial Award is presented to the top overall applicant of the Indigenous Scholarship & Bursaries Program.

Who is eligible to apply

ELIGIBILITY

BC Hydro invites applications from Indigenous students who are:

- From a BC First Nation or are an Indigenous permanent resident of BC.
- Registered at a Canadian post-secondary institution between September 2022–April 2023 in a part-time program that closely matches to careers at BC Hydro.

Important dates

Application period: Bursary applications are accepted by email from **April 1, 2022 to May 31, 2022**.

Application deadline: Application packages must be received by **4:00pm closing time on May 31, 2022**.

Application package requirements

- Students must ensure all application requirements are met before submitting an application.
- Students must take responsibility to ensure that all information is up-to-date and included in the submission package.
- Only electronic submissions will be accepted. Include all attachments in one email. We will send you an email notification when your application has been received.

The following documents are required to complete your application package:

- 1. Completed application form
- 2. Personal narrative in a written or video format
- 3. Copy of your Canadian post-secondary registration letter
- 4. An unofficial transcript from your most recent studies
- 5. Copy of your Status/Métis card or a letter from your band or Métis office
- 6. A letter of reference that speaks to why you would be an outstanding recipient of a BC Hydro bursary. The letter should be from a community leader, coach, employer, teacher, faculty member, etc.

How are selections made?

The applications received by the deadline will proceed to the next evaluation step.

Applications will then be evaluated based on the following:

- Career goals that are aligned with BC Hydro's business and career paths
- Noteworthy achievements and participation in school or community activities
- Presentation skills as demonstrated in application package

All communication is directed to each student who is notified by a formal letter emailed by the end of July. This letter will advise whether the applicant will receive an award or not. Recipient award letters include further required details in order to process the Bursary funds.

Bursary funding guidelines

- Bursaries are for the September 2022 to April 2023 school year only and cannot be deferred to the next school year.
- Indigenous Bursary payments are administered directly from BC Hydro to the award recipient to offset school fees, books and supplies, living expenses, or any other expenses at the discretion of the recipient.
- Due to the administration process, this bursary may not be released in time for tuition fee deadlines.
